
## **KENNEBEC HIGHLANDS**

Round Top Trail

Location: Rome, Kennebec County

**Description of Hike**: The winding trail ascends 1,133 feet up Round Top Mountain meandering through young and old hardwood and conifer forests before opening up to views of Long Pond, Belgrade Lakes Village and Great Pond. From the top, experience 360 degrees of spectacular views ranging from the Belgrade Lakes Below to the White Mountains, Mount Katahdin and the Camden Hills. Photo: Land for Maine's Future



**Directions**: From the intersection of Routes 27 and

225 in Rome, travel north 1 mile on Route 27 to Watson Pond Road. Turn left and travel 4.5 miles. The trailhead is located on the right at the corner of Watson Pond Road and Wildflower Estates.

**LMF Background**: In 1999, the Belgrade Regional Conservation Alliance (BRCA) matched a grant from LMF to protect over 6,000 acres of wooden hills and wetlands just north of Augusta. The Highlands, which includes the highest peak in Kennebec County, is home to moose, deer, bear, coyotes, bobcats, foxes, turkeys,

waterfowl and other wildlife. There are more than 18 miles of old logging roads and trails to explore.
