LMF Background: Seeking to fill the need for water-based recreation areas in western and central Maine, the Department of Conservation secured funding through LMF to purchase 8,000 feet of shorefront on Lake George and created a park in 1992. In 2002, a second LMF grant extended the park to 320 acres including an additional 2000 feet of shorefront. Lake George has become a popular recreation area, attracting 27,000 visitors each year. Community members enjoy the park for swimming, fishing, boating, hiking, cross-country skiing and ice-fishing. The Annual Fishing Derby is held each February, and the Lake George Fiddle Festival and Maine Mountain Bike Challenge take place each fall. There is a \$3 entrance fee to enjoy the park.
