## SCARBOROUGH BEACH

**Location**: Scarborough, Cumberland County

**Description of Hike**: From the parking lot, the trail passes by Massacre Pond to the beach. Bring a picnic lunch to enjoy on the beach after walking along the shore.

**Directions**: From Route 1 in Scarborough, take Route 207 south 3.5 miles. The park is on the left, about 1 mile after the Route 77 intersection.

## Local Attractions:

 Scarborough Salt Marsh – Rent a canoe and discover the waters of Scarborough Marsh. The 3,000 acre expanse of marine land is managed by the state to protect the delicate salt marsh ecosystem. The information center located on Route nine is staffed by the Maine Audubon society and provides information on the marsh, shorebirds and other wildlife.

**LMF Background**: Located just outside of Portland, Scarborough Beach's white sands attract 60,000 visitors annually who come to swim, surf, fish and walk along the coast throughout the summer. With the support of LMF and the Trust for Public Land, the Bureau of Parks and Lands bought the beach to help protect this fragile spring-fed wetlands and dune ecosystems. Massacre Pond, surrounded by pine, oak and woody shrubs, is a popular skating area for local residents.
