



Earth Day Challenge for Kid Artists!

Background: 2012 is the 50th anniversary of *Silent Spring* by Rachel Carson. This book, published in September of 1962, helped launch the environmental movement. The book changed our society through the connection of human beings with all other life around us. Rachel Carson demonstrated the effects of dangerous chemicals, most notably the pesticide DDT, on the environment, particularly on birds. Bald Eagles and other species suffered huge population declines as a result of this poison.

What: Local kids are invited to create images, no larger than 8.5” by 11” of a pollution-free world in honor of Earth Day and Rachel Carson’s contribution to a cleaner environment. This artwork will be featured in a slide show on NRCM’s website at www.nrcm.org.

Why: Primarily to nurture the connection between people and the natural world particularly as Earth Day approaches.

Special Note: Artwork submitted for this occasion will automatically be included in our search for an image to use on a t-shirt for our 5k and kid’s fun run event in September that will honor the 50th anniversary of *Silent Spring*. The event will raise funds for and awareness about NRCM’s ongoing work to keep toxic chemicals out of Maine’s air, water, wildlife, and forests.
