Let me share some additional information about the project. The proposed CMP corridor would require cutting a new fifty-three mile long corridor through forests in Western Maine. The corridor would be 300-foot-wide and would deliver electricity generated by Hydro-Quebec to customers in Massachusetts. Proponents claim the project would create jobs, benefit Maine communities, and help protect the environment, while opponents claim the project would damage Maine's environment, harm renewable energy companies, and primarily benefit residents of Massachusetts.

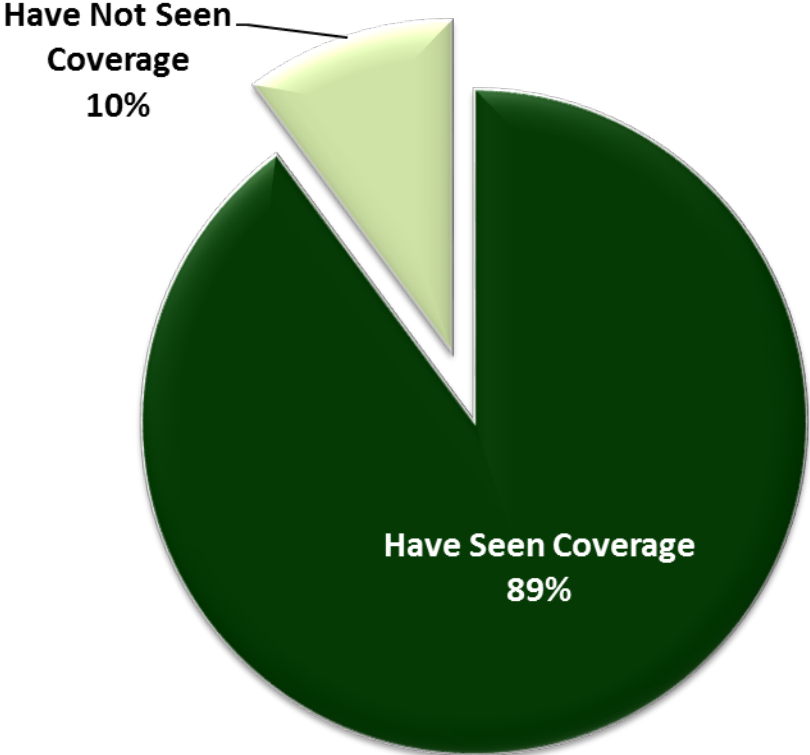

Background & Methodology

- **This document presents the results of a survey conducted by Critical Insights on behalf of the Natural Resources Council of Maine.**
 - The purpose of the survey was to gauge views toward an electricity transmission corridor that Central Maine Power is proposing to build through western Maine in order to deliver energy from Canada to Massachusetts.
 - **The survey was conducted by telephone between March 11 and March 27, 2019.**
 - A total of 850 respondents took part in the survey.
 - Among these 850 respondents, a total of 299 are residents of Franklin County (124 respondents) or Somerset County (175 respondents), as these are the counties most directly impacted by the proposed transmission line.
 - **In order to qualify for the survey, respondents were required to live in Maine and be registered to vote in the state.**
 - The results of the statewide data presented in this report have a margin of sampling error of +/- 3.3 percentage points at the 95% confidence level.
 - Final data were statistically weighted to reflect the age, gender, and county populations of the state.

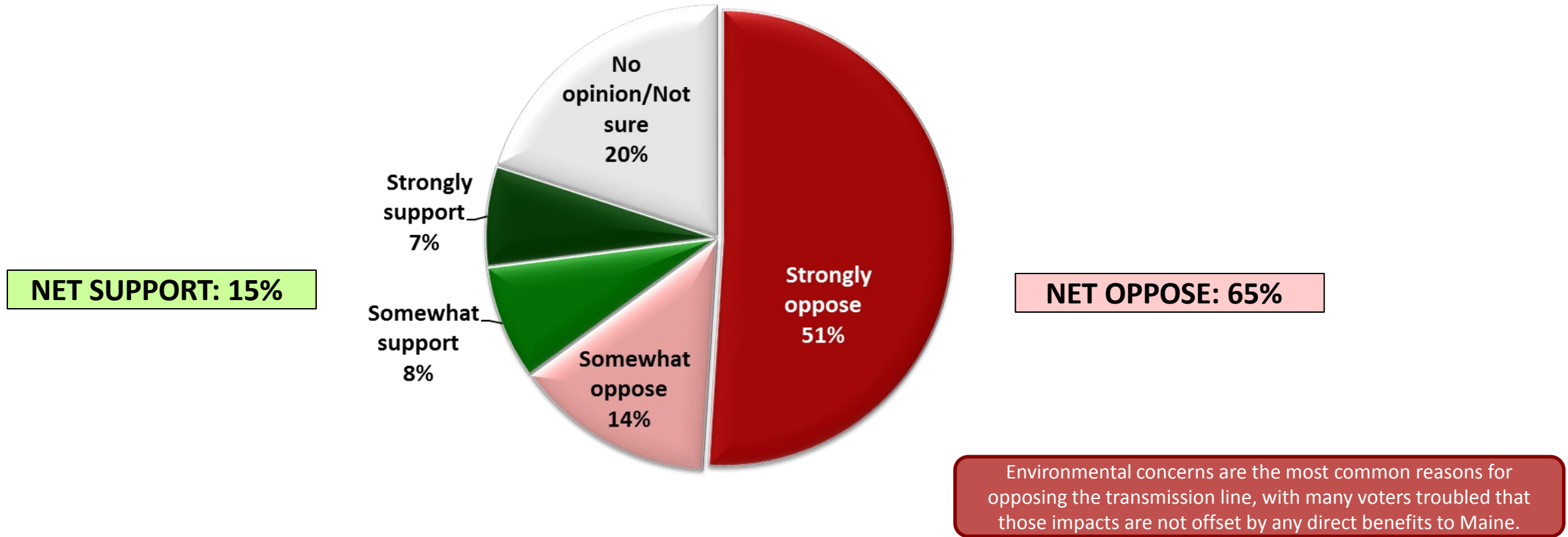

Top of Mind Position: With No Positive or Negative Information in Question

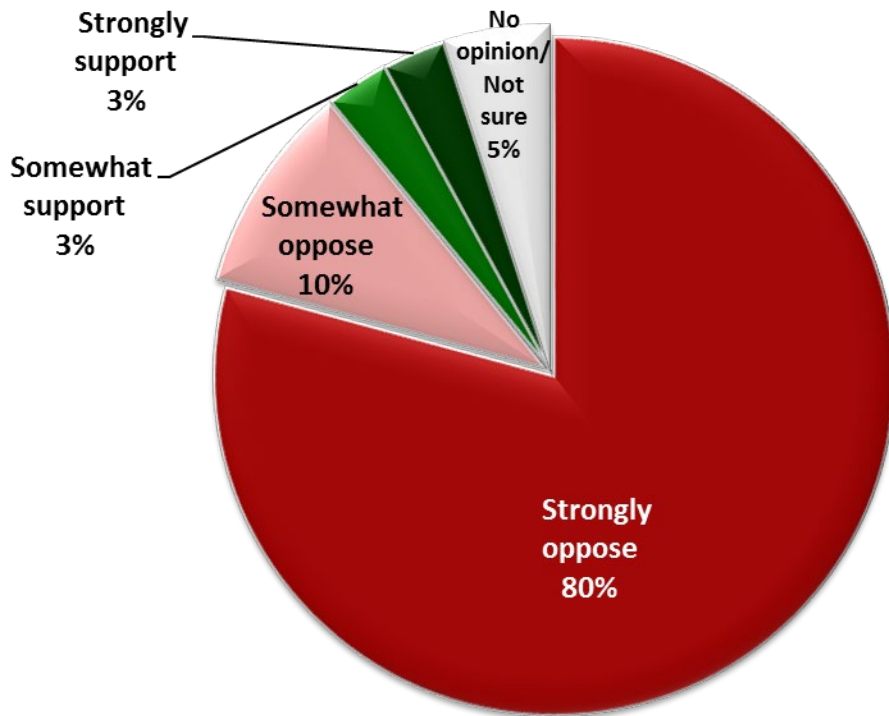

Top of Mind Position: With No Positive or Negative Information Provided

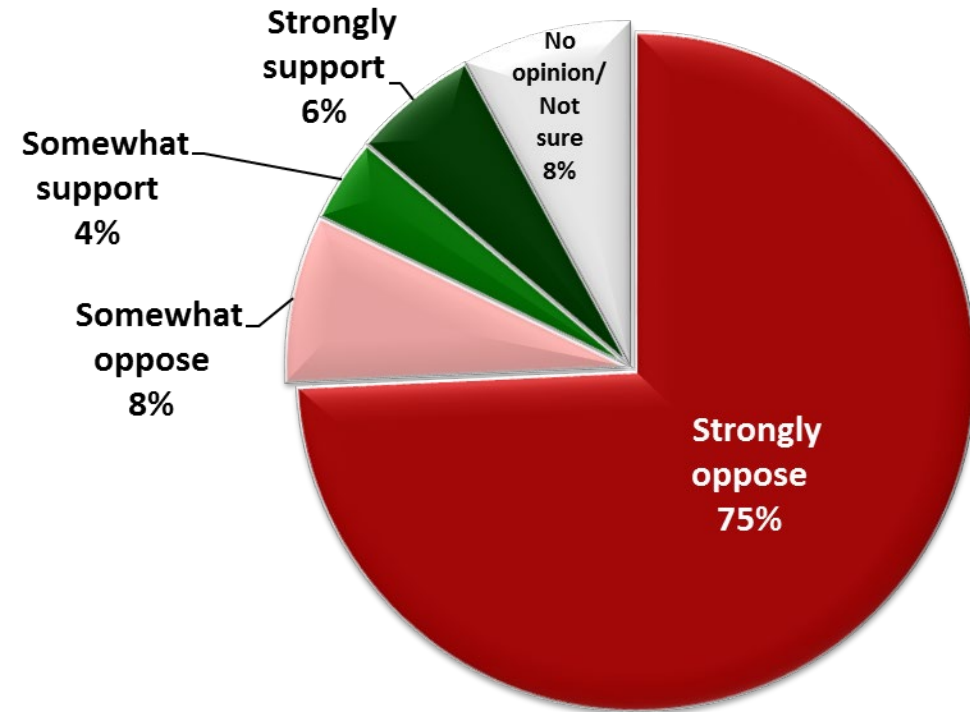

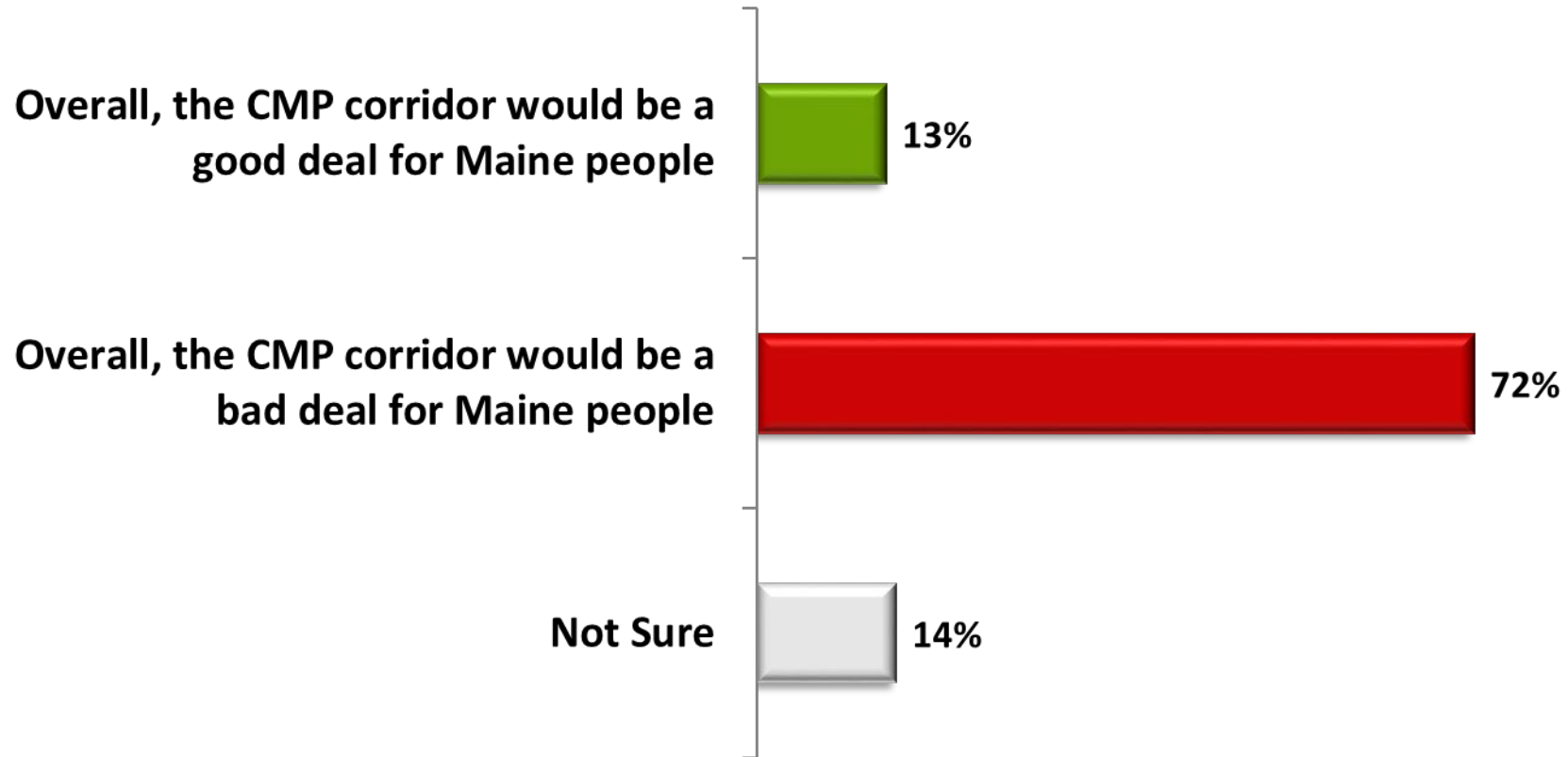

Which comes closest to your view?



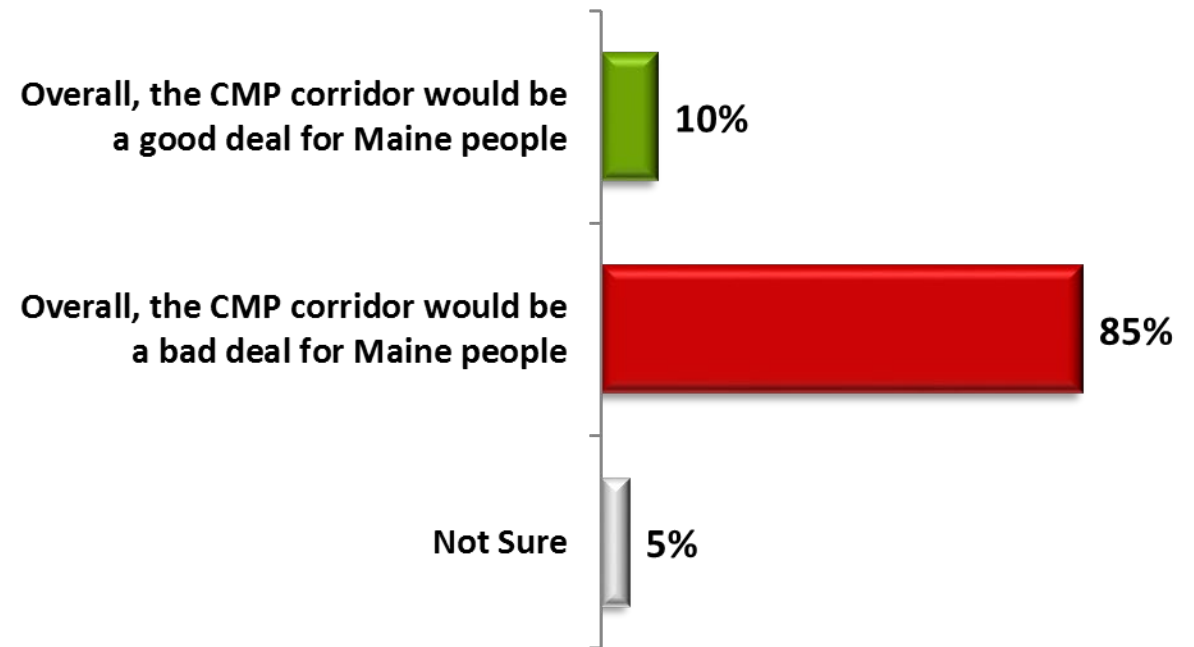
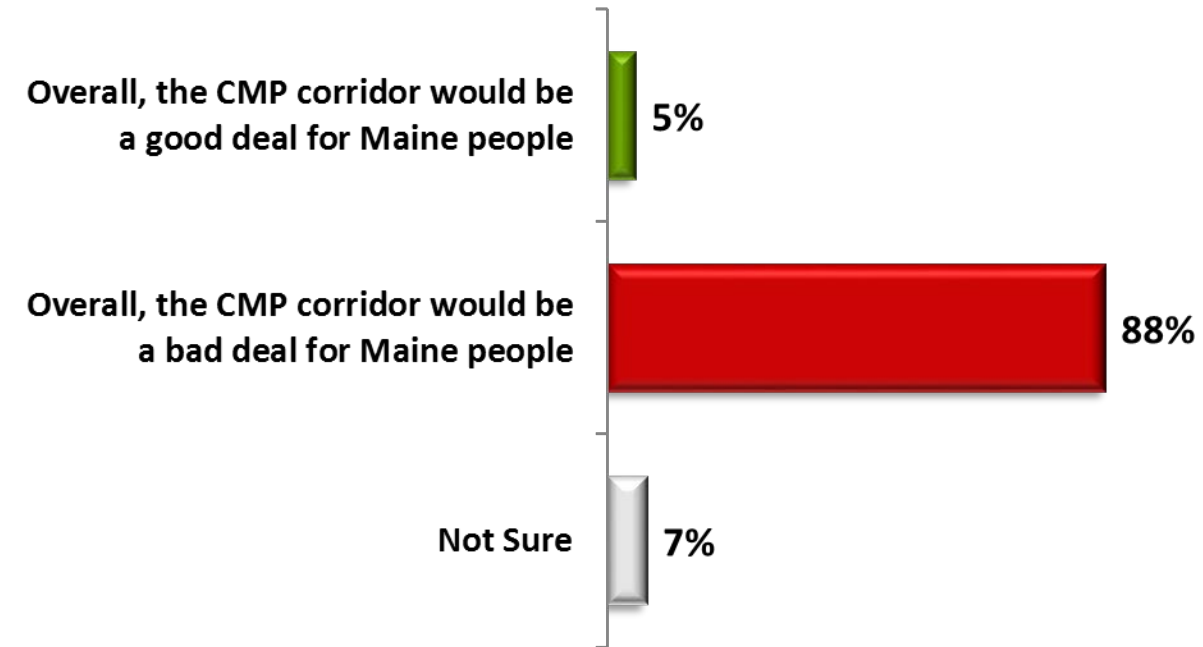

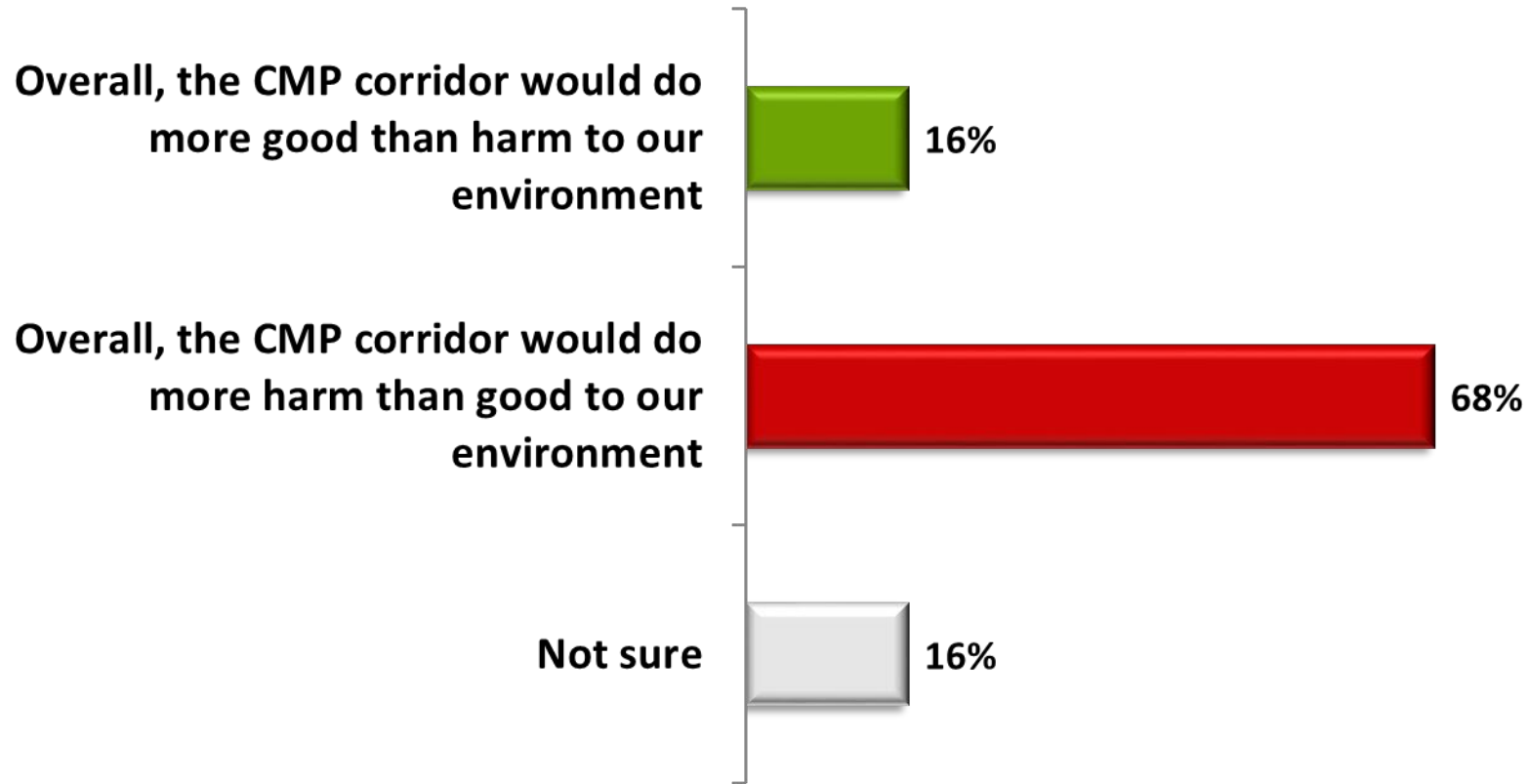

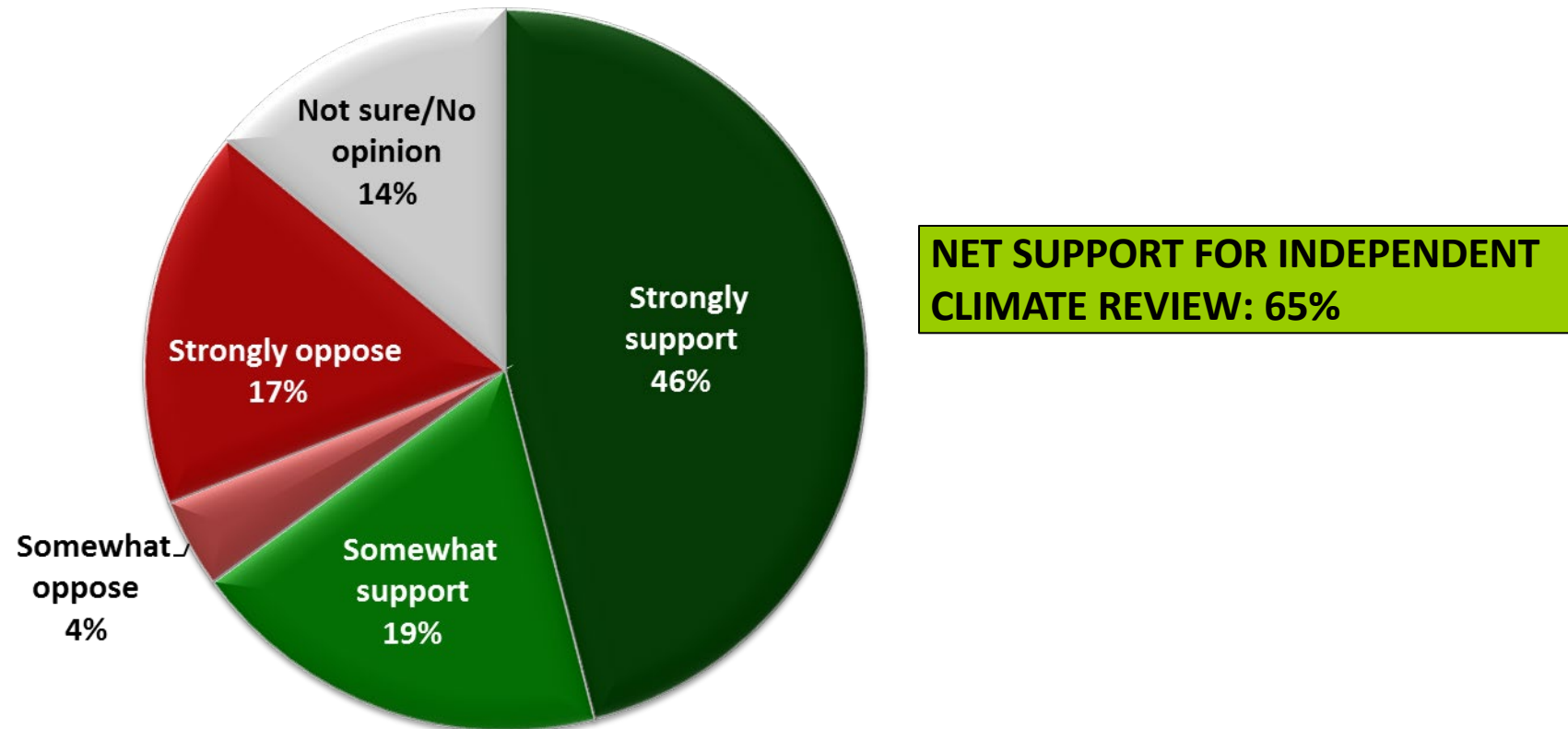

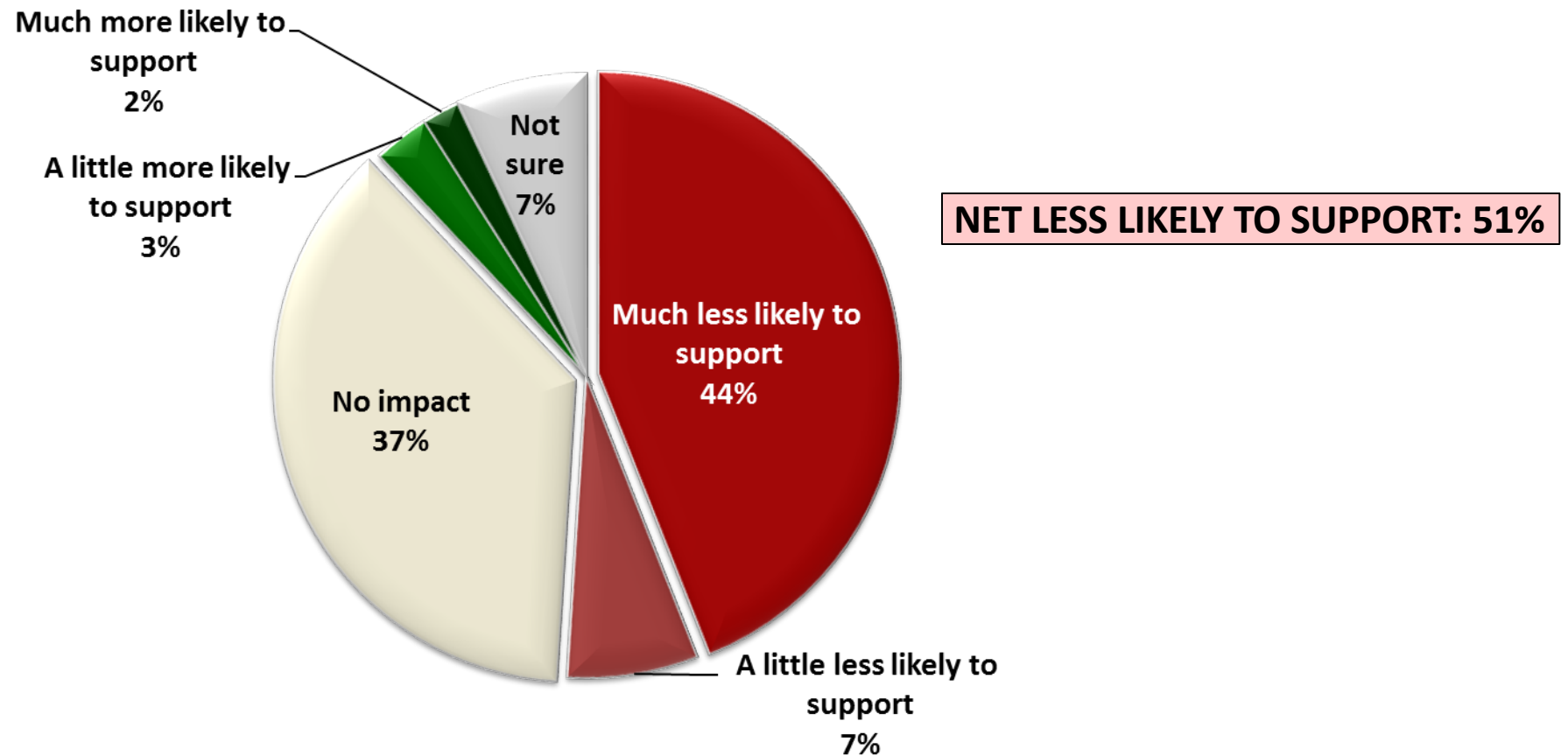
Support for Independent Review of Greenhouse Gas Pollution Impacts of Transmission Line

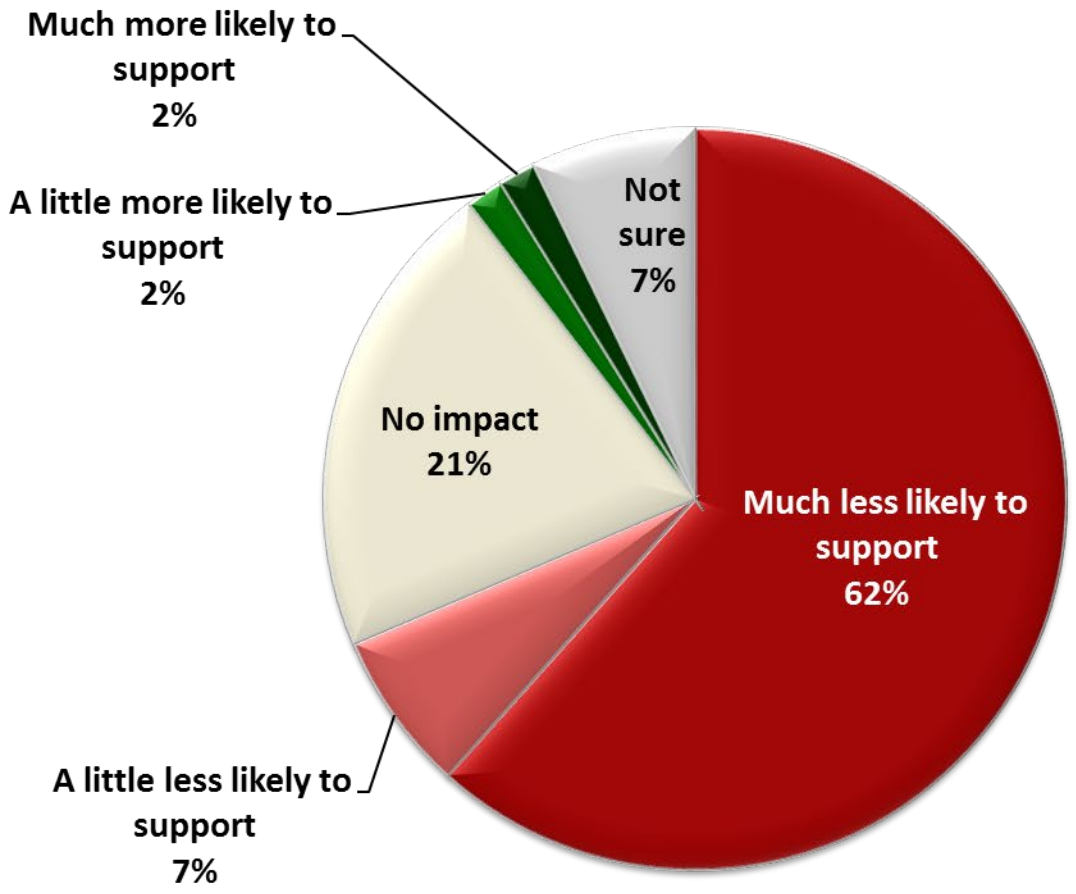
Reactions to Potential Reduction in Electricity Costs

Support if CMP Bypasses Local Authority

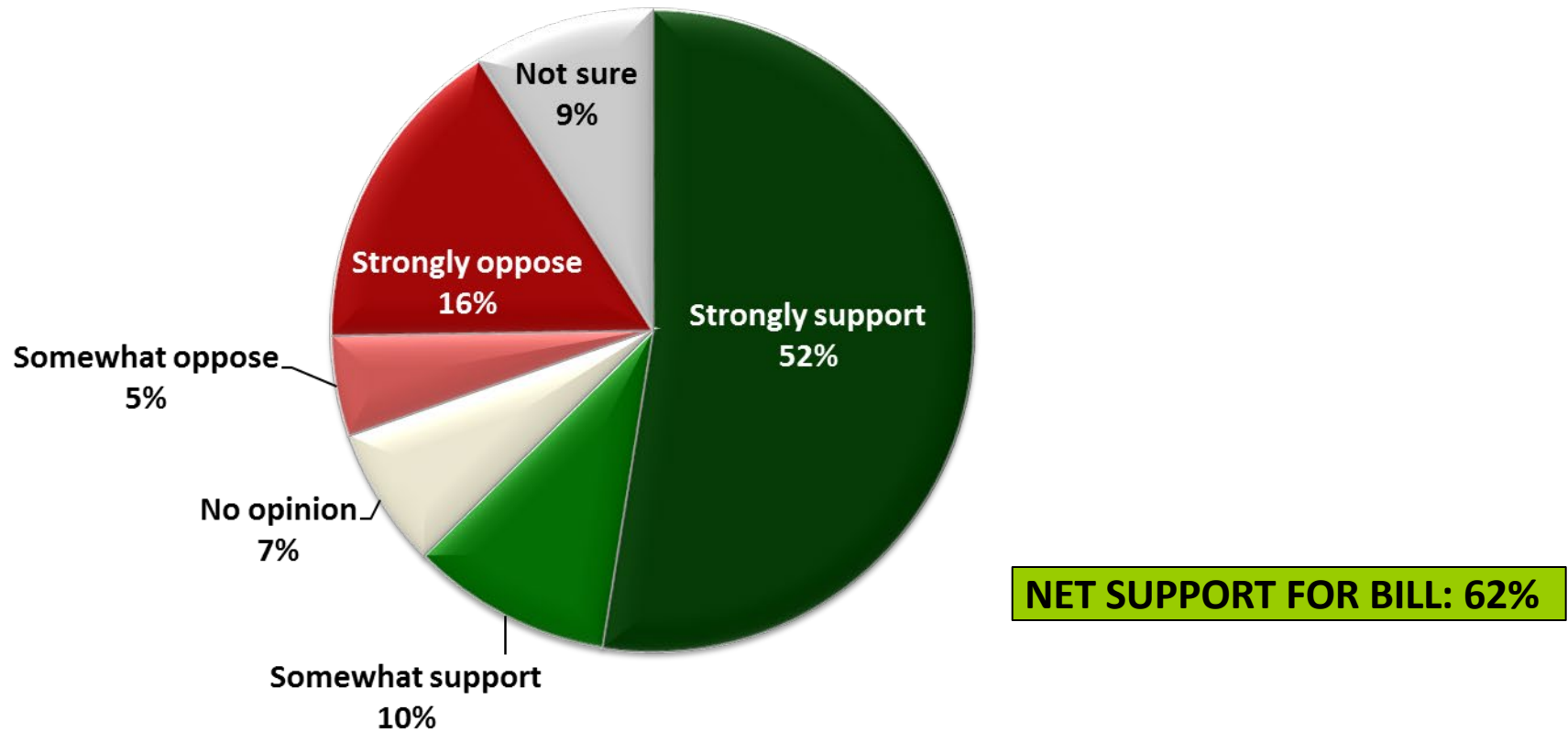

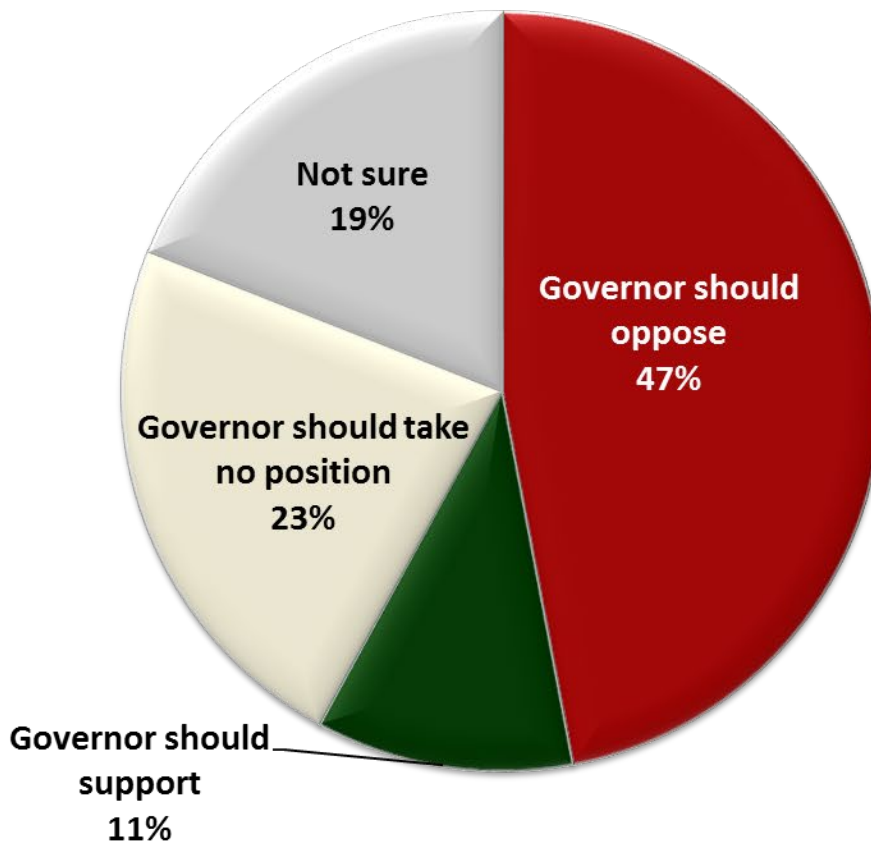
Support for Bill To Prevent Bypassing Local Authority

Position of the Governor on the Project



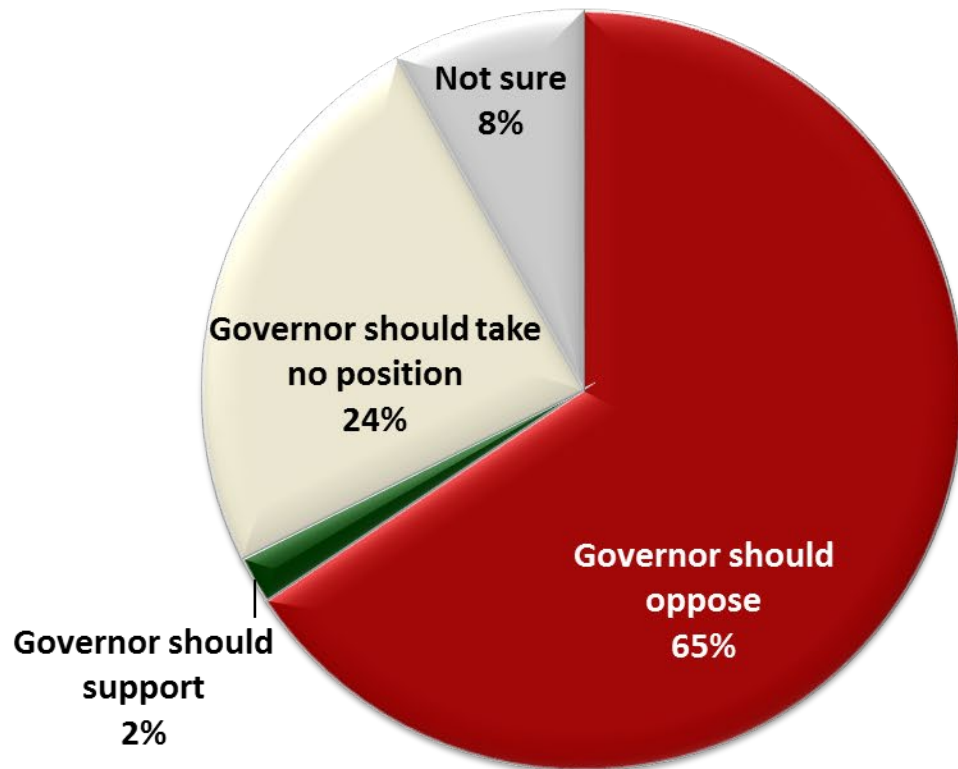

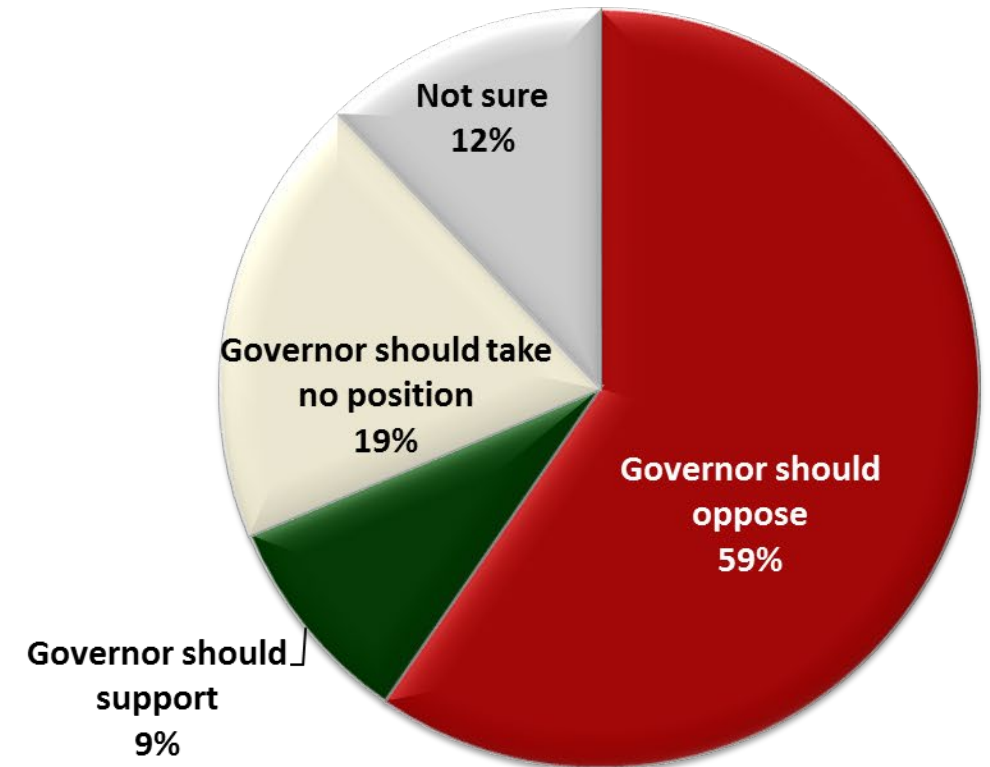

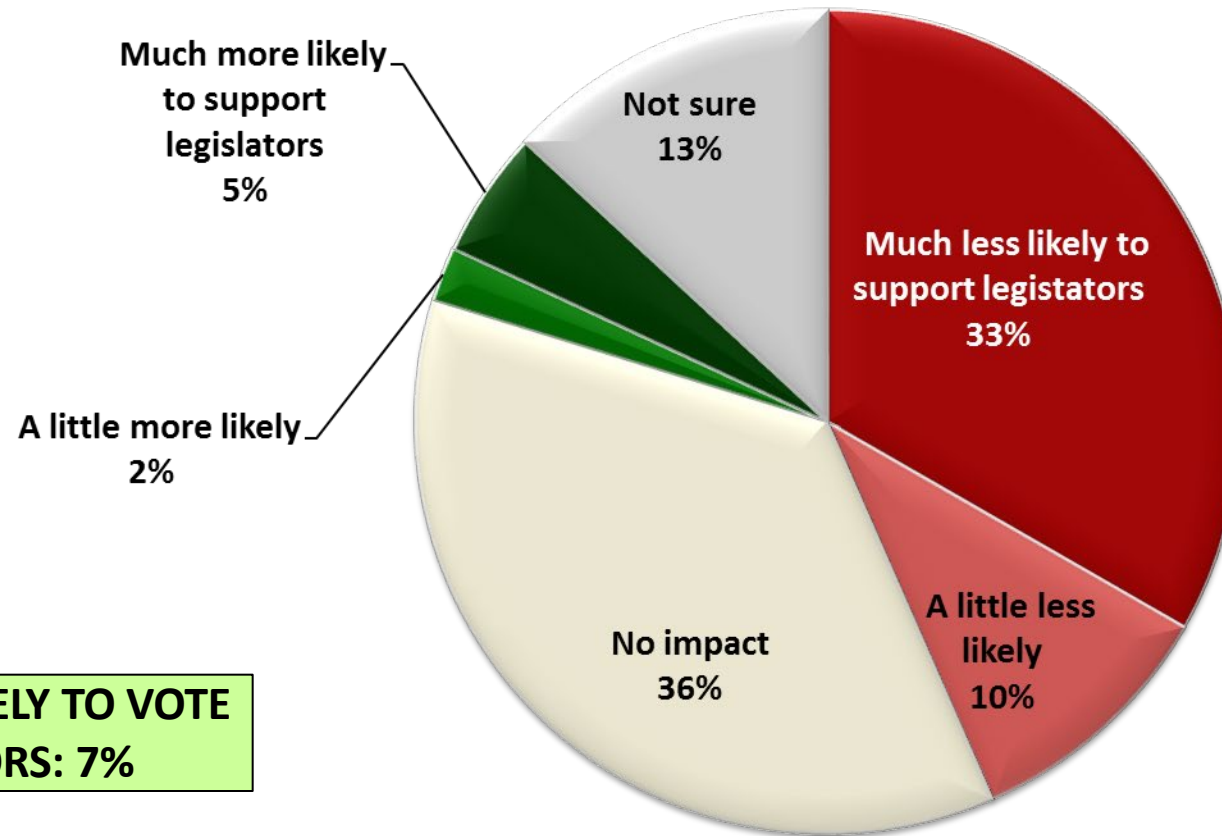

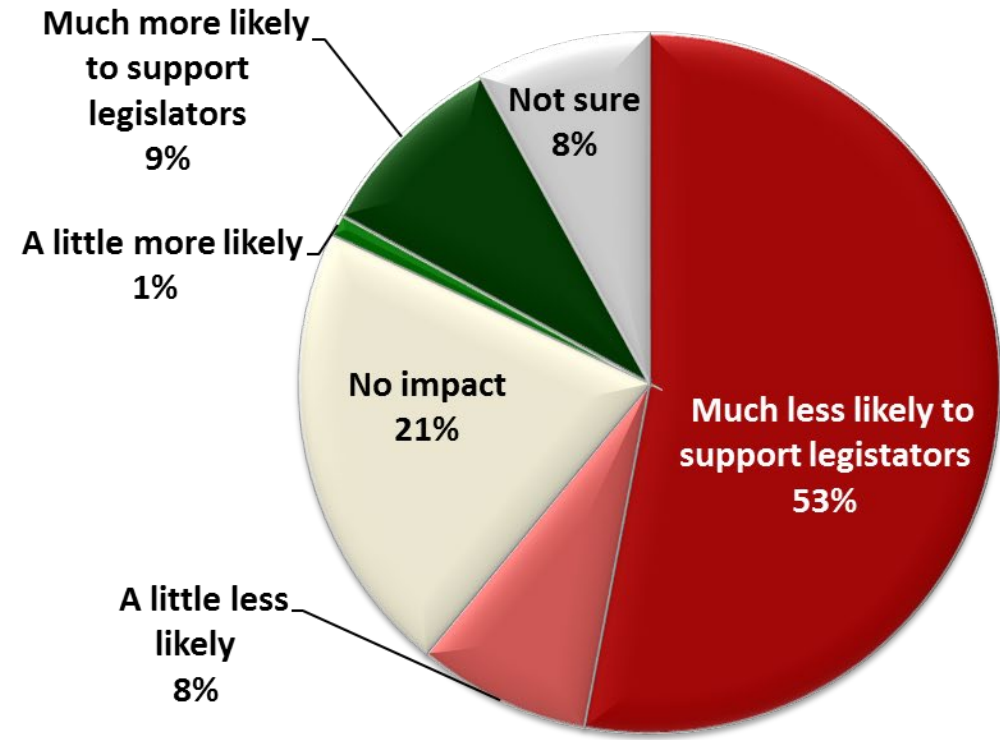
