As seen in Table 3-1, the seven predominant waste types received at the JRL facility during 2017 included construction and demolition debris (CDD), CDD processing residue wood fines, MSW incinerator ash, MSW, CDD processing residue bulky waste, FEPR, and municipal/Industrial WWTP/POTW sludges. In compliance with JRL's permit condition, wastes going to the landfill were screened in advance in order to assure that no out-of-state wastes were accepted at the facility.
